Drought tolerant and climate adapted, these species feed the birds and butterflies in your yard



Help re-wild the inland area with sustainably grown native plants from Riverside-Corona Resource Conservation District's nursery. A rotating selection of dozens of species are available throughout fall and winter at the LandUse Learning Center demonstration garden in Riverside.

Stock is updated weekly. Plants are \$10 for one-gallon pots, and \$25 for trees. Our selection includes shrubs, flowers, sages, grasses and more.

The cool season is the perfect time to put native plants in the ground as the weather is milder, and seasonal rains can help them get established before the summer heat. Native plants are adapted to our climate, and generally take less water and care than non-native species. They also provide food and habitat for native birds, butterflies and other pollinators.
